Spotlight on SMSD Volunteer Co-Puppy Raisers

Smoky Mountain Service Dogs (SMSD) depends greatly upon the volunteer spirit and generosity of the community to support its efforts in providing well-qualified service dogs to veterans. A critical volunteer role is raising a puppy for a 9-12 month time period. Puppies may be co-raised with another volunteer. We have had several co-puppy raising partnerships including, Renee King and Debbie Lathrop, who raised Oak; Carole Martin and Debbie Lathrop, who raised Honor; and Andee Raker and Ginger Stone currently raising Wylie. These experienced puppy raisers have shared with us a few of the positive aspects of this unique experience.

- 1. Having a partner in the learning process to encourage and mentor each other based on individual strengths and weaknesses is critical. There is an Increased learning curve when a new volunteer is paired with an experienced puppy raiser.
- 2. Flexibility in the schedule, allowing time for other family responsibilities. After the time off from puppy duty, the volunteer can feel recharged. As partners, you support each other creating the schedule that best fits your lifestyles.
- 3. Keys to success include communicating regularly to discuss new skills and training issues. Asking each other for suggestions.
- 4. Benefits for the puppy include an increase in the puppy's exposure to social encounters and different environments.
- 5. On a personal note, new friends are made through this process.
- 6. Ultimately the veteran and first responder recipients benefit through this process.

What Heather Wilkerson, SMSD Program Manager, has to say about sharing the puppy raising responsibilities:

"As the co-puppy raising program evolved, I realized the advantages this special arrangement offered our volunteers, as well as our young dogs in training. The puppy teams realize the importance of continuity in handling and training, so they communicate regularly. I want to thank all our puppy raisers and offer special thanks to those who were willing to participate in the pilot program. You all made me believe in this and our young dogs benefited from it. Many thanks to our puppy foster coordinator, Deb Scarrietta. Deb consistently does an excellent job pairing our co-puppy foster teams


