You will be happy to know that John and his wife are conscientious of the environment and both drive electric cars. John and his family have a special connection to Wylie. John's brother donated to the acquisition of Wylie and requested the name. Wylie is a family name passed down to more than five descendants since the Civil War. As a result, John has a special interest in that era. He has written and epublished a book The Company of Girls 1862-1865, a historical book which illuminates the circumstances of women living on farms along the TN River during the Civil War. In addition to his role as a canine transporter, John has also been a socializer for the last two years providing opportunities for our kennel dogs to accelerate their development. Prior to his retirement John was a Superior Court Judge for 24 years.
